The Future Perfect Project is a national arts initiative amplifying the voices of LGBTQIA+ youth across the United States through high-quality creative programming and professional artistic mentorship. By producing and facilitating in-person and remote programs in podcasting, music, creative writing, and more, we provide young people with queer-affirming spaces and professional tools to express themselves authentically, connect with others, and share their vision of a better future for us all, one in which everyone is free to be themselves.

Writer's Room

A monthly, online, free writing workshop that focuses on developing writing skills and tools for creatives of all backgrounds and experiences.

Every month, we gather online to discuss topics through a queer lens, respond to writing prompts, and honor the writer

in all of us. Queer guest-facilitators are welcomed into the space to share their personal experience as a writer and artist. This workshop is great for those who are just discovering their voice, and for anyone who wants to continue expanding and developing their artistic point of view. We invite participants to connect with the community, share, reflect, and respond.

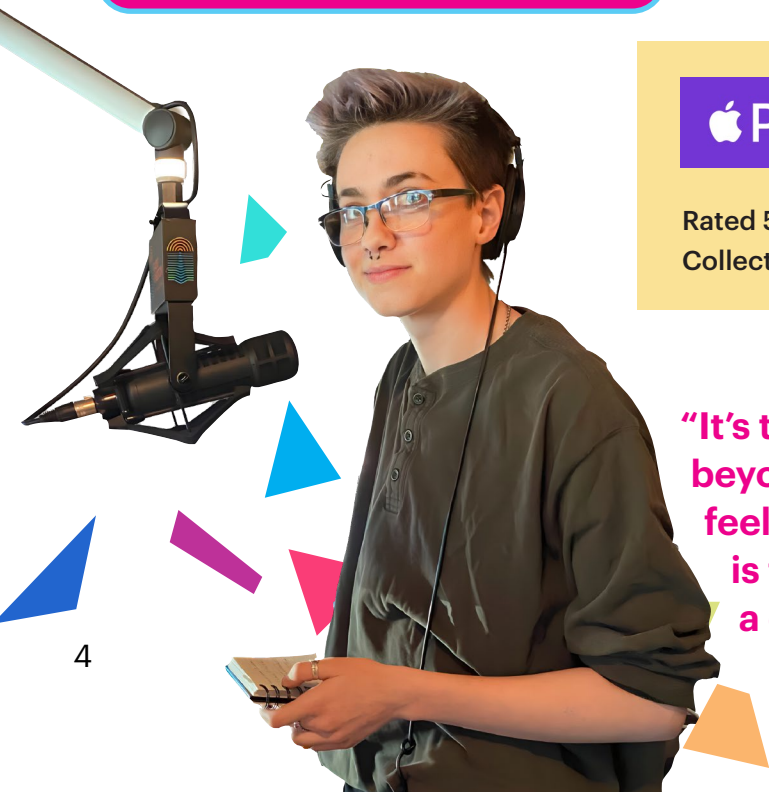


The IFQT! Podcast Producer Team

Future Perfect Records

A free online residency for LGBTQIA+ singer-songwriters, musicians and music producers, ages 14-22

Young musicians from around the country collaborate to create a full-length album and learn the ins and

outs of the business from queer guest facilitators in the music industry. The program has assembled two cohorts that have each produced an album together: *Not What You Pictured* in 2022 and *DIVINITY* in 2023. Both cohorts met in person in New York City to celebrate their release and perform their original songs live for the very first time. **We are currently seeking partnership for the 3rd season of the program.**

In-Person Workshops

We partner with LGBTQ Centers, arts institutions, and schools across the United States to provide queer-affirming spaces for creative practice, artmaking, and peer-to-peer connection, all in-person and 100% free to the youth.

ARTIVISM: A Community Speaks to Itself

As our primary in-person workshop, ARTIVISM calls on its participants to move through a series of writing and songwriting prompts to tell their own stories and express their vision of a possible future. At the end of a week-long workshop, these young people share their work in front of the student body or community at large, and document their work as shareable audio or video.

The Last Grove: Queerness & The Environment

In Spring 2022, in collaboration with Atlantic Theater and theater-artists nicHi douglas and Jeanna Phillips, a cast of eight LGBTQIA+ young writer-performers rehearsed for two weeks to create a devised theater piece about the human species and climate damage titled *The Last Grove*. The piece was performed outdoors in New York City.

Future Perfect Records: Live in New York City

In June 2022, as part of Lincoln Center's Pride programming, our first cohort of ten LGBTQIA+ singer-songwriters from around the country met in-person for the very first time in New York City to perform their album live. Then in October 2023, Future Perfect Records Season 2 celebrated the release of their album *DIVINITY* with a sold out performance at The Public Theatre in New York City.

Queer Youth Animated

An episodic series of two-minute films featuring diverse stories of the queer experience told by the youth themselves, animated by an entirely LGBTQIA+ team of professionals, most of whom identify closely to the interview subject.

Throughout 2020 & 2021, The Future Perfect Project interviewed queer youth about their lives, giving them the opportunity to talk about such topics as coming out, blended families, relationships, peer acceptance, homophobia, activism, and more. The interviews are then edited to two-minute portraits, then animated and scored by an entirely LGBTQIA+ team of professionals, most of whom identify closely to the subject. The result is this series of short animated documentaries that depict the very essence of the generation.

The Future Perfect Project provides a chance for participants to turn their kryptonite into their superpower by creating empowering animations that center themselves as the heroes.

Our Story



I've been fortunate as co-founder of The Trevor Project to be on the front lines of change as several generations of young people have come of age. But in 2017, I noticed

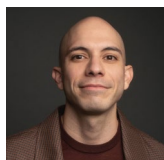
a change in the LGBTQIA+ youth themselves. They were building a network of connections, finding one another online (as well as in person), offering one another encouragement, and redefining what it means to be queer. And so, I teamed up with singer-songwriter, Ryan Amador, traveling the country, and providing LGBTQIA+ Youth with a safe space to engage in creative writing and performance. When possible, we facilitated a live performance for a larger community audience in an effort to help queer, trans and allied youth become more safe, seen and celebrated.

We soon added producers/facilitators, Julie Novak, Emma Seslowsky and Jon Wan and activated a close network of queer artists, writers, mentors and co-facilitators. During the pandemic we continued to offer online opportunities for youth to create art, and we began to produce and broadcast their work to a larger audience. In this way, our community has continued to grow and we are empowering the young people to speak their truth and sing their songs of tomorrow. While lawmakers are busy passing laws and proposing measures to limit the self expression of LGBTQIA+ youth in their schools and communities, FPP has handed the mic over to the next generation. So we can hear from them directly.

It seems the world is never quite ready to know what a younger generation sees or feels, but change happens when young people begin to age-up and make the future happen. The Future Perfect Project is amplifying the voices of LGBTQIA+ youth and broadcasting a future in which every person gets to be perfectly and fully themselves.

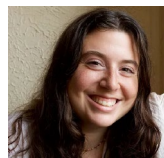
David Artavia (he/him)

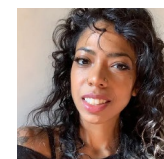
Emma Jayne Seslowsky (they/she)

They have written three novels for young adults, and created *The Letter Q*, a collection of letters by queer writers written to their younger selves. An actor as well as a writer, Celeste has created several award winning solo shows including *The Absolute Brightness of Leonard Pelkey*, *Word of Mouth* and *One Man Band*.
